



LANDMARK'S E STREET CINEMA

Corner of 11th and E Streets NW, Washington, DC

Landmark's E Street Cinema is a jewel, with multiple auditoriums, and a gourmet concession stand, complete with a full bar.

Metro/Walking

The theater is located 2 blocks from the Metro Center station and 4 blocks from the Gallery Place station.

Driving

Landmark will validate parking for 3 hours at the reduced rate of \$11 after 5:00pm on weekdays and all day on weekends at the garage adjacent to the theater (entrance on 11th between E and F Streets – the lot closes at midnight). In addition, limited metered street parking is available.

Biking








All ticket and pass holders must be seated 15 minutes prior to showtime to guarantee a seat. After that time, pass holders will be admitted with the general audience on a space-available basis.

- 20 minutes before each showcase...Pass holders and filmmakers are admitted to the theater.
- 15 minutes before each showcase...Ticket holders are admitted to the theater.
- 10 minutes before each showcase...Unclaimed seats are sold at the theater door for \$15.

The standby line will form 45 minutes before the screening time. What are your chances of getting in? Pretty good – we usually release a minimum of 20-40 tickets at the door.
